



Continental Divide National Scenic Trail

North of Rawlins to the Medicine Bow Nat'l Forest.

North of the forest boundary, the CDT transitions from forest to open prairie, snaking northward through Rawlins and Carbon County. Hiking, mountain biking, horseback riding and motor vehicle use are allowed on the majority of the Trail, however there are a few segments that are unavailable to motorists.
