Miracle Mile is the 7-mile stretch of water between the Kortess Dam and Pathfinder Reservoir. This segment garners its name for its quality blue ribbon trout fishing. Trophy size trout caught here weigh between 5 and 10+ pounds.

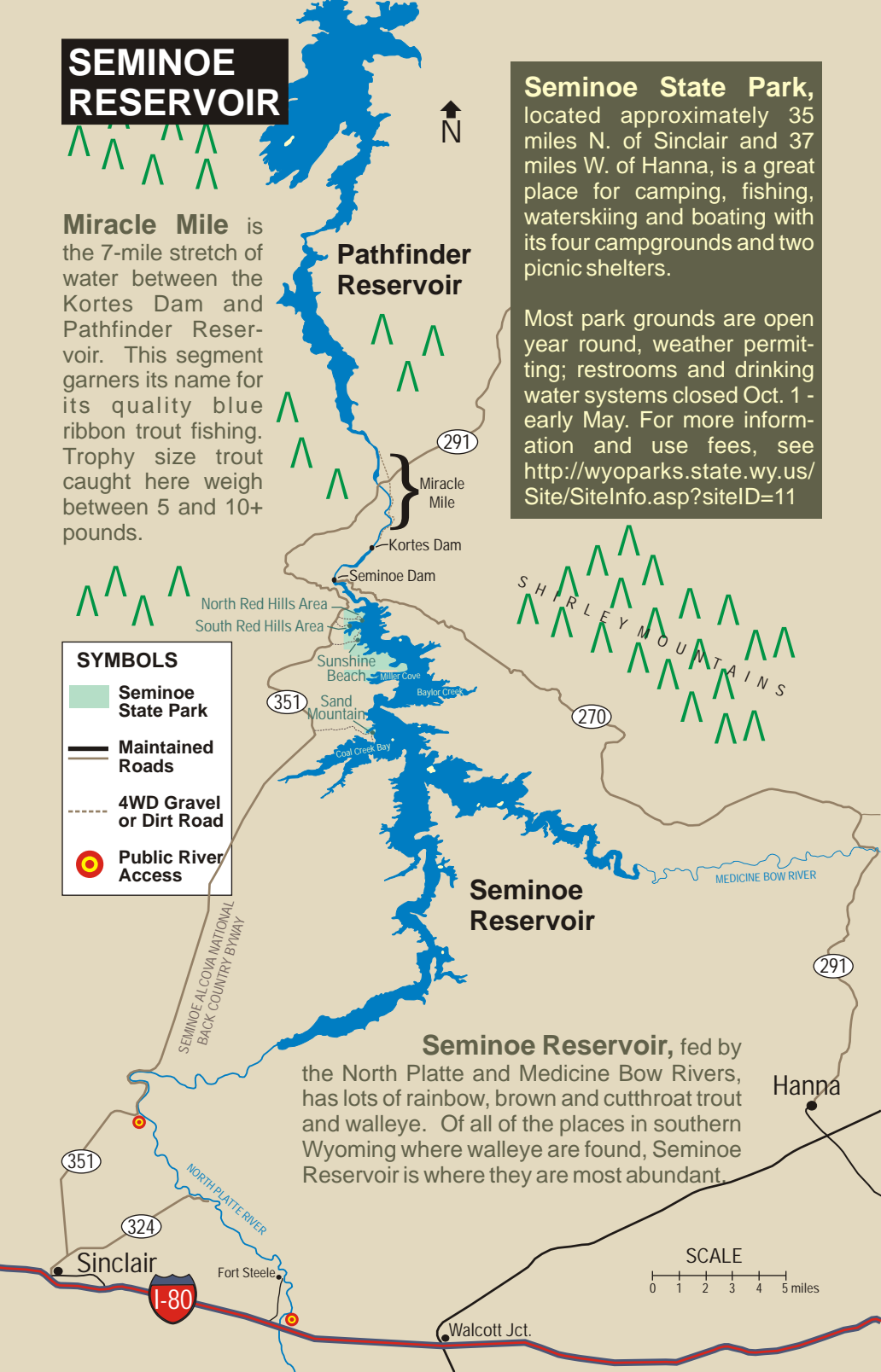
Seminole State Park

located approximately 35 miles N. of Sinclair and 37 miles W. of Hanna, is a great place for camping, fishing, waterskiing and boating with its four campgrounds and two picnic shelters.

Seminole Reservoir, fed by the North Platte and Medicine Bow Rivers, has lots of rainbow, brown and cutthroat trout and walleye. Of all of the places in southern Wyoming where walleye are found, Seminoe Reservoir is where they are most abundant.
